Student Affairs at Auburn University houses 13 departments that have the responsibility for ensuring a true learning community committed to providing transformative educational experiences for all students, offering services to parents, and encouraging a culture of excellence at Auburn University.

### ASSESSMENT & STRATEGIC PLANNING

The office launched a new website ([auburn.edu/studentaffairsassessment](http://auburn.edu/studentaffairsassessment)), providing access to a variety of tools, resources, and information.

### CAMPUS RECREATION

Auburn Outdoors is taking 10 student staff members to the Arkansas Regional Outdoor Conference. Two of the students are presenting and one received a scholarship to attend.

### CASE MANAGEMENT AND ADVOCACY

The office received 69 general case management referrals in March 2016, compared to 44 in March 2015.

\$50,000 pledge for Student Counseling Services; \$30,000 gift for the Veterans Success Fund

### MEDIA & PUBLICATIONS

Eagle Eye TV had 23 students apply for staff positions this spring compared to 13 students in spring 2015.

### MEDICAL CLINIC

3,990 patients visited the Med Clinic this March, a 9% increase compared to March 2015.

### AWARDS

The Federal VA Auditor found zero findings during the **VETERANS AFFAIRS** annual audit.

**THE STUDENT AFFAIRS DEVELOPMENT TEAM** received an award for surpassing its goal by the greatest percent.

### STUDENT CENTER

Student Center had 505 room reservations in March 2016 compared to 494 in March 2015.

### STUDENT CONDUCT

Student Conduct trained 18 Interfraternity Council executive officers and cabinet members to serve as third party investigators in the student organization investigation process, a 50% increase from spring 2015.

### STUDENT COUNSELING SERVICES

1,235 individual, emergency, and group sessions were conducted in March.

### STUDENT INVOLVEMENT

The Student Government Association received 225 cabinet applications and 78 members were selected. The average GPA of applicants was 3.42.



### VETERANS AFFAIRS

The Veterans Resource Center had 235 visitors in March compared to 223 visitors last month.

**SHELBY SIMS** in Campus Recreation officiated the 1A Girls and 2A Boys semi-final and 3A Girls and 4A Boys final basketball state championship games.
