Student Affairs at Auburn University houses 14 departments that have the responsibility for ensuring a true learning community committed to providing transformative educational experiences for all students, offering services to parents, and encouraging a culture of excellence at Auburn University.

AUBURN CARES

Received 94 referrals to the Auburn Cares office in April 2017 compared to 73 referrals during April 2016.

EETV saw 48,336 page views on their website, Eagleeyeauburn.com in its first month.

CAMPUS RECREATION

The Bike Shop at Auburn Outdoors served 172 members in the month of April. This is a 25% increase from the month of March, when Auburn Outdoors served 138 members.

DEVELOPMENT

Development raised over \$10,000 for the Veterans Resource Center at the Veterans Center Golf Classic.

GREEK LIFE

Greek Sing, a song and dance competition, raised over

\$36,000

for the Lee County chapter of Habitat for Humanity, an increase from \$20,000 raised last year.

HEALTH PROMOTION & WELLNESS SERVICES

TESI, an alcohol screening program, served 53 new people in the month of April 2017, an increase from 16 new people in March 2017. This is a

231% increase.

MEDICAL CLINIC

The average satisfaction score for patients in April was 98%.

PARENT & FAMILY PROGRAMS

Auburn University hosted the inaugural Parent and Family Programs Professionals State Drive-In Conference for Alabama in April.

STUDENT CENTER

The Student Center saw 161,593 visitors during April 2017 compared to 153,690 in March 2017.

STUDENT CONDUCT

The Office of Student Conduct held eight Student Conduct Committee hearings during the 2016-17 academic year compared to seven hearings during the 2015-16 academic year.

STUDENT COUNSELING SERVICES

1,315 individual, emergency and group sessions were conducted in April 2017, compared to 1,244 sessions in April 2016.

STUDENT INVOLVEMENT

Students participating in IMPACT, a student service organization, completed a total of 9,530 community service hours this academic year compared to 8,676 hours last year.

VETERANS AFFAIRS

The Veterans Resource Center served 508 visitors in April 2017.

AWARDS

Student Counseling Services was reaccredited by IACS (International Association of Counseling Services).

Tess Gibson and **Brad Smith** were selected to attend NASPA's New Professionals Institute.

Troy Stephens Jr., advisor in the Office of Greek Life, was awarded the New Professionals Scholarship to attend the NASPA Region 3 Summer Symposium.

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
