ORGANIZATIONS



Beyond the other portfolios highlighted, Student Involvement is also home to ~500 Registered Student Organizations (RSO's) & Sponsored Student Organizations (SSO's) each year. RSO's allow students to build community with others that share a similar interest, and SSO's allow students to work closely with a university college's or department's interests.

During the 2023-2024 Academic Year:

- Student Involvement was home to 485 student organizations (not including Greek Life or Club Sports)
- 17,094 students (51.8%) were a member of at least one student organization.
 - 14,758 undergraduate students
 - 2,336 graduate and professional students

PROGRAMMING

The University Program Council (UPC) is the student-run programming board that provides a variety of events for students every year.

A few signature events hosted by UPC include:

- The Fall Concert
- The Homecoming Parade
- The Holiday Lighting Ceremony
- The Magnolia Ball A formal for all students
- The Stadium Movie

During the 2023-2024 Academic Year...

- 62,300 total attendees (14,180 unique students) registered their attendance at events held by UPC and other Student Involvement student organizations.
- During the First 56, 18,427 (8,301 unique) students checked into a First 56 event.






Auburn University Dream Makers – Annual effort to raise money for the NICU and Pediatric units at East Alabama Health.
















• The Auburn Plainsman is the most decorated non-daily college newspaper in the country and is a member of the Associated Collegiate Press Hall of Fame.









LEADERSHIP
