

THE YEAR IN REVIEW

Since its establishment at Auburn in 1878, the Greek Community has instilled values of academic excellence, philanthropy, and servant leadership in thousands of sorority women and fraternity men. Today, about 9,000 students – 34% of the undergraduate student body – belong to one of Auburn's Greek organizations. This report provides an overview of each council and highlights key data for each chapter.



YEAR IN REVIEW



The **PANHELLENIC COUNCIL** hosted its largest primary recruitment in council history, with 1,893 potential new members registered.

The NATIONAL PAN-HELLENIC COUNCIL (NPHC) brought back its signature event, Tiger Stomp, in November in partnership with the Black Student Union. With over 300 students, faculty, staff, and alumni attending, the step show is the council's most prominent social event and featured seven step teams, including guest teams from Tuskegee University and the University of Montevallo this year.

The INTERFRATERNITY COUNCIL (IFC) was awarded certificate recognition in Civic and Philanthropic Engagement and Educational Programming this spring from the Southeastern Greek Leadership Association Conference.

PANHELLENIC held "Circle of Sisterhood Week" in September, consisting of benefit nights and concourse events. They raised \$9,220 for the National Panhellenic Conference's official philanthropy, Circle of Sisterhood, which aims to provide financial resources for entities worldwide that remove educational barriers for girls and women facing poverty and oppression.

NPHC welcomed Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. and Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. back to the council in March.

IFC welcomed Sigma Pi back to the council in January.

Through the annual Greek Sing event held in April,

PANHELLENIC raised over \$140,000 for the AuburnOpelika Habitat for Humanity. The event proceeds will
go toward building houses in our community.

NPHC hosted five "Wear your Letters Wednesday" concourse events in the spring. Chapter members were encouraged to wear their organization's letters on campus and showcase their chapter pride, increasing the council's visibility.

3 Through their annual spring philanthropic events, Batting Practice with Butch Thompson and IFC Skeet Shoot, the **IFC** collectively raised \$10,000 for the Hudson Family Foundation.

In July, emerging leaders from **NPHC** and **IFC** attended the Undergraduate Interfraternity Institute in Bloomington Indiana. Students participated in a four-day leadership experience, building skills and confidence to impact change within their chapters and community.

PANHELLENIC was recognized in two major categories,
Campus Impact and Community Cultivation, this spring
at the Southeastern Greek Leadership Association
Conference. Additionally, the council received certificates
in Academic Achievement, Leadership Development,
Campus and Community Relations, and Civic and
Philanthropic Engagement.

NPHC participated in Auburn High School's annual Historically Black Colleges and Universities Expo hosted by the Ace Club to educate high schoolers about the collegiate experience in culturally based organizations and perform step routines.

The **IFC** delegate program organized its second annual food drive. IFC donated over 1,000 items and \$2,210 to the Campus Food Pantry, benefiting students facing food insecurity at Auburn University.

UNDERSTANDING THE DATA

This report is patterned after the national Fraternity and Sorority Scorecard created by the Timothy J. Piazza Center for Fraternity and Sorority Research and Reform. The National Fraternity and Sorority Scorecard aggregates data across member institutions to better understand how councils and chapters perform on key indicators. The scorecard gives institutions and national organizations the information they need to benchmark their local chapters against the national landscape. Auburn University is a participating member of the National Fraternity and Sorority Scorecard. This scorecard is created twice a year during the fall and spring semesters. Due to data collection, the scorecard is distributed in the following fall or spring semester.

Membersh

Membership rosters are submitted by each chapter to Greek Life every semester. The rosters are verified to be Auburn University students.

Academics

All academic information is calculated by the Auburn University Office of Institutional Research using the membership rosters provided by the chapters.

For organizations with three or fewer new members, the reported new member grade point average is not reported and is shown as "***" to ensure confidentiality in the community regarding student grades. The individual chapter receives the comprehensive grade reports.

Conduct

If a chapter is found responsible for violating university policies, a checkmark appears under the type of violation – alcohol, hazing, or other. The checkmark indicates the organization has been found responsible for violations through the Code of Student Conduct or the Interfraternity Council judicial process. Please note that this report lists organizational misconduct and not individual misconduct.

Definitions for types of violations are:

- Alcohol Any violation that includes the misuse or distribution of alcohol.
- Hazing Any hazing violation as defined by the Auburn University Hazing Policy.
- Other Any other violations, including trespassing, fire/life safety, etc.

Fraternities and Sororities suspended from Auburn University during the reported semester will appear in this report but will be listed with an asterisk to indicate that they are no longer in good standing with the university. All fraternities and sororities must comply with the Greek Life Expansion Policy and any governing council policies to return to campus. Organizations are not guaranteed automatic approval to return after a suspension.

Service and Philanthropy

Philanthropic dollars and service hours are self-reported by each chapter. The data reported corresponds with data provided to the organization's headquarters.

Not all organizations submitted complete information. The following symbol indicates the response by the organization.

- Dash () indicates the number zero (0) was submitted.
- No Submission (NS) indicates no information was submitted on the chapter's behalf.
